For one, the role of technology in keeping the proverbial trains running—including helping managers maintain their team’s ability to stay connected and also remain productive despite their physical distance from each other—has become a huge area of focus and investment over the last two years. Equipping employees with the right tech, tools, and solutions has been the key to ensuring a continuous and seamless flow of work.

Unfortunately, all of the latest and greatest tech in the world can’t stop distractions from actually happening around you during online meetings. Much of that is out of our control, whether we like it or not. But that doesn’t mean there can’t be a way to safeguard our online meetings from going pear-shaped as a result. # It's time to break down the “invisible wall” of the mute button

No one will argue that communicating with each other via digital screens is simply not the same as communicating face-to-face. While technology has certainly advanced in mind-blowing ways to make online interactions more real-world-like than ever, there's a naturally unavoidable amount of distance that exists between participants during online meetings.

In a world before Krisp—which, from our perspective, is an unthinkable reality—the typical online meeting goes something like this. The team manager or whoever is running the meeting starts by asking everyone to mute their lines. Or in a more rogue move, just mutes everyone's lines outright and tells participants to unmute when it's their turn to speak.

Let's be honest, not everyone always follows the rules or, and this is the more likely case, participants simply forget to mute and unmute as the call goes on. This creates a cacophony (literally!) of sounds that make it hard for people to stay focused on the conversation at hand.

Herein lies the more endemic problem: the infamous mute button. The simple act of muting and unmuting—which is a byproduct of being innately concerned about noises and distractions swirling around you—makes it hard for call participants to stay focused and engaged in the conversation at hand. In many ways, it creates a barrier that further strengthens the “invisible wall” that ultimately gets in the way of the natural flow of online meetings.

Plus, when there's a lot of activity swirling around employees in their non-office work environment, the knee-jerk reaction for them is to keep the mute button on to avoid looking unprofessional in front of whoever else is on the call. This can create a tremendous amount of stress and anxiety, making people less confident on calls and, thus, less willing to risk disrupting a call to ensure their voice—and point of view—is communicated and heard.



Then there's also the case of the mute button operating as a "protective shield" that enables people to play a more passive role in their online conversations. While they may be physically present in those online meetings, keeping themselves muted the entire time means they're only listening in and not necessarily participating actively. Or participating in equal amounts to other more extroverted or outspoken team members on the call.

Whether people are trying to keep whatever havoc is happening around them from disrupting their online meetings or simply choosing to be less engaged in a team's conversation by keeping themselves perpetually on mute, hiding behind the mute button has created even more distance between remote teams. And it doesn't make solving the bigger issues around team collaboration, engagement, and productivity in this new era of remote work any easier.



# Krisp makes the mute button a moot point!

Knowing that the mute button is one of the biggest culprits impeding the effectiveness of virtual team meetings, the engineers at Krisp decided to put advanced artificial intelligence (AI) and machine learning to work to make the mute button a non-issue once and for all.

But simply giving people a reason to not be trigger happy with the mute button wasn't enough. We also wanted to provide hybrid teams with useful tools to help them get the most out of their online meetings. Krisp, therefore, achieves this on two key fronts:

## 1. Meeting Experience

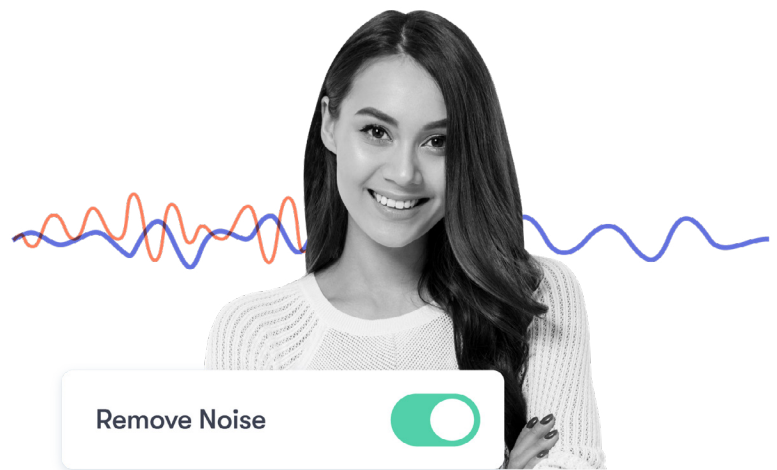
From the very beginning, Krisp's core functionality has been noise cancellation—and, quite frankly, we do it better than any other player in the market. This is because we've taken a full 360-degree approach to make background noise virtually disappear like magic.

Here's what that actually means when you look at the app's features and functionality in detail:

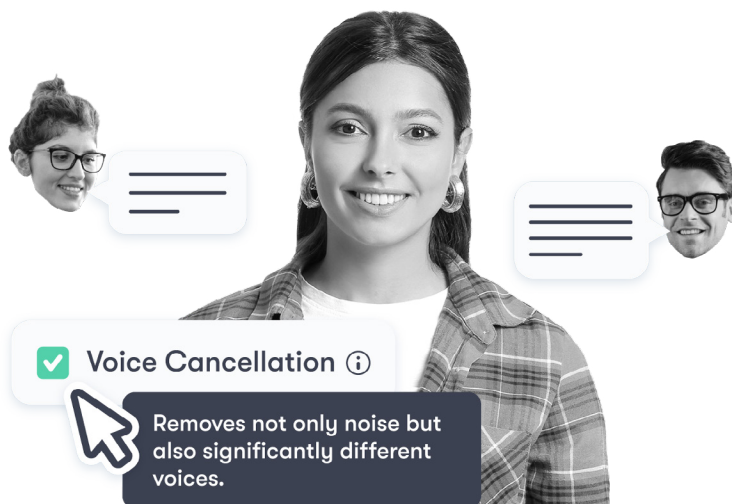
### Bi-Directional Noise Cancellation

In the simplest of terms, Krisp serves as an AI-powered layer that sits between users and the microphones and speakers natively installed on their devices. Headsets fall into this category, too. When Krisp is installed on a device, with a single click you can filter out all of the background noises happening within your environment so that people on the other end of the line—whether be it a softphone-based online call or a video meeting with multiple participants—don't hear anything else other than your beautiful voice.

That alone is a massive feat in and of itself. However, what makes Krisp even more unique, setting it miles apart from others who merely dabble in the world of noise cancellation, is the promise of bi-directional noise cancellation.



What this basically means is that—thanks to this aforementioned AI-powered layer—potentially disruptive sounds coming from other participants on the call, whether or not they have a noise cancellation solution installed, will be filtered out, too. The end result is much clearer call quality, where all participants on a call can hear each other's voices loud and clear without noises getting in the way.



## Voice Cancellation

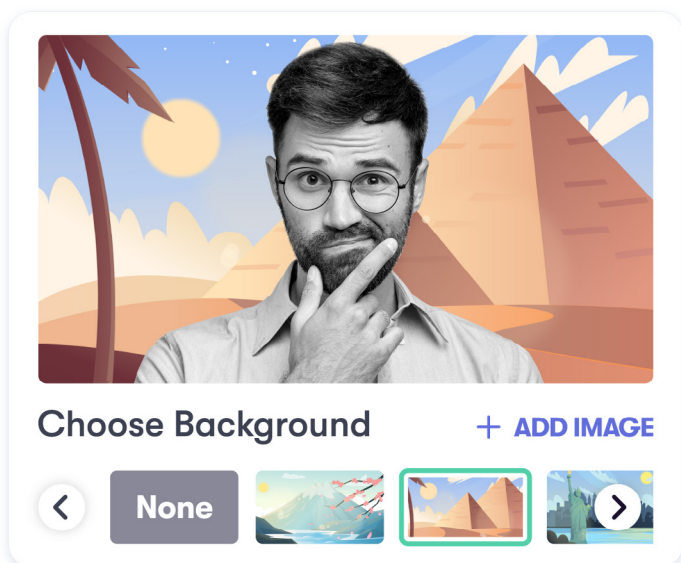
Krisp has recently gone where noise cancellation hasn't gone before. Now, in addition to filtering out background noises, Krisp can be programmed to recognize your voice's pitch—high, medium, or low—and then subsequently filter out competing voices that are not

in your same pitch range. This is a gamechanger for people who work in open-office or co-working spaces where it can be easy for other people's conversations in the background to be picked up during calls.

Even more, we're already working on innovating this feature further so that, eventually, it can instantly shine a spotlight on a single user's voice just with the toggle of a button.

## Echo Cancellation

We've all been on those calls where a room's acoustics—from home office setups to conference rooms at the office—lend themselves to all sorts of echoes and reverbs that make it really hard to understand what someone is saying on a call. Krisp corrects for this as well, once again ensuring a user's natural HD voice quality.



## Virtual Backgrounds

Depending on the nature of your online meeting, sometimes you don't necessarily want other participants to see what's happening in the background. Or during a sales call, for example, you might want to create a professional, fully-branded experience (versus putting your dining room home office setup on display).

With Krisp, you can choose from a variety of pre-populated virtual backgrounds or even upload your own to create the most optimal video call experience possible. And as the cherry on top, these virtual backgrounds can be applied to any online meeting regardless of the video conferencing app you use. In other words, choose your background within the Krisp once and then use it everywhere—instantly.

## Seamless Integration

Similar to Virtual Backgrounds, once Krisp is installed on your device, it can



be used as the default microphone and speaker on any softphone or online conferencing app imaginable—even when you use headphones for your calls. Basically, Krisp acts as a single noise cancellation solution that can be downloaded once and used seamlessly, with just a single click, whether or not the apps you use already have a built-in noise cancellation feature or not. But trust us, even if they do, their ability to minimize noise is a far cry from what Krisp’s superpowers can do.



## 2. Meeting Insights

Although noise cancellation is Krisp’s bread and butter, we are rapidly unveiling a suite of new features to help individuals and teams visualize real-time call metrics like never before. Here’s a preview of what’s available today as well as what’s coming in the near future:

### Talk Time

This newly-released feature allows people to visually keep track of how much time they spend talking in relation to other participants on any given call. For example, it can encourage super talkative folks to be a bit more mindful about hogging the spotlight—and, thus, potentially shutting others out of the conversation—while also giving less assertive team members a gentle nudge to speak up and make their voices heard. And for managers stop online calls, looking to boost engagement and collaboration across

their dispersed team, especially at a time when people are really getting burned out from non-stop online calls, it can be an effective way to ensure that people don't allow themselves to fall into the rut of hiding behind the invisible wall of the mute button.
